Attendance

- ✓ Students must be in attendance on the first day of school.
- ✓ State law requires that students be in attendance 90% of the school year. This equals a maximum of nine absences per semester or 18 absences for the school year.
- ✓ Administration will be monitoring attendance and tardies weekly which will affect the student's discipline record.

Food Service and Payment-Preferred Meals

Twelve Oaks Catering and Food Service of Dallas, TX has been selected to become the new meal vendor for breakfast and lunch service at ACA.

Twelve Oaks has been serving the DFW area since 1989. They are in partnership with many schools and some businesses. They are committed to using local products and resources to provide a meal program that includes:

- quality lean meats including turkey, turkey ham, chicken breast meat/baked drumsticks/baked thighs, and ground beef (no pork is included in their menus),
- wholesome low-fat cheeses, various yogurts, and eggs,
- fresh home-made breads many of which are whole grain,
- a wide variety of fresh vegetables ~ which are cooked and prepared in their kitchen,
- salads of lettuce mixes and dark, green leafy produce such as romaine, spinach, and kale, and
- fresh fruits including melons, berries, and tropical fruits all within their own juice, not a syrup.

Twelve Oaks has their own **in-house bakery** which provides home-baked bread goods that are included in their breakfast and lunch menus. These items include muffins, cinnamon rolls, sticky buns, fruit pastries, bagels, bread sticks, yeast rolls, cornbread, and biscuits, among others. Twelve Oaks is committed to high quality fresh foods.

Uniforms & Dress Code

- All shirts must be monogrammed
- Shoes can be any color, but must be closed toe and heel, and PE appropriate. Shoes cannot have lights or make sound.
- Belts must be worn by 1st and 2nd graders if belt loops are present.

Masks (optional)

All masks (and anything used to secure a mask or face shield) must be school appropriate (masks cannot display profane, obscene or otherwise inappropriate language and/or symbols like drug or alcohol references, sexual references, etc. Gang-type symbols, even if just perceived, or patently offensive symbols or otherwise any design that distracts or interrupts the educational environment, are prohibited.) While masks will not be required to match approved uniform colors, ACA highly recommends simple, solid color or patterned materials.

ACA teachers or staff will not be responsible for student masks. Staff will not monitor masks, even at parent request, so that the teachers can dedicate their time and energy for caring for, designing instruction for, and teaching ACA students. This includes requests by parents for students to be seated close to or away from students with or without masks.



Desk Shields

Transparent Desk Shields: While ACA will no longer provide desk shields, parents may request through the campus principal that their student be allowed to use a desk shield that is provided by the parent. Desk shields must be transparent so that the student can see and participate in instruction. Desk shields cannot be used if it disrupts the ability of the student or other students to access the learning taking place. If the request is granted, the placement or seating of the student may be altered (ie: to the perimeter of the classroom) by the teacher in order to ensure that the learning environment of the classroom is not hindered.

Morning Drop Off

- ✓ Primary and Mixed Multiples (Mixed Multiples are cars with both Primary and Intermediate children) can be dropped off beginning at 7:00 AM. Parents should enter the drive and continue to the east side of the Primary building.
- ✓ From 7:00 to 7:40AM, students that can exit their cars on their own, should exit from the driver's side of the car in the left lane (lane closest to the primary building). Please know that there will be limited staff on duty from 7:00 AM to 7:30 AM, therefore students will need to exit cars themselves. A staff member will be supervising the students that are unloading outside and another staff member will be monitoring the cafeteria, where students will wait. If your child exits the car from the passenger side, please use the right lane.

Daycare drop off

- Daycares can begin dropping off students at 7:00 AM on the East side of the Primary building. All daycare buses will go through the car line.
- Daycare buses carrying Intermediate only students will go through the Intermediate drop-off line.



Afternoon Pick Up

- Placards will be <u>required</u> for everyone. Cars that do not have placards will be asked to park and go to the office to get a placard.
- Pink placard: Primary A-L (last names beginning with A-L).
- Orange placard: Primary M-Z (last names beginning with M-Z).
- Green placard: Primary & Intermediate Mixed Multiples.
- Blue placard: Intermediate students only.
- The drive will open at 3:05 PM for Primary parents. Primary A-L parents should enter the right lane from Arkansas and Primary M-Z parents should enter the left lane from Arkansas.
- Mixed Multiples parents should enter the left lane of the drive from Arkansas at 3:30 PM and proceed to the south side of the Primary building to pick up students.

Homework and Health

- ✓ H&H is an after school program especially designed for students of ACA. It serves students Kindergarten – 8th grade
- ✓ It includes homework assistance, games/sports, technology time, fitness training and nutrition education
- ✓ Cost- \$30 one-time registration fee
 - Full Time tuition- \$250/month
 - Part Time tuition- \$25 daily rate
 - o Drop-In (must already be registered) \$30

First Day of School-Kindergarten

Kindergarten families will be permitted to walk their children into the classrooms on Wednesday, August 10th. In order to ensure all traffic has cleared for both campuses, we are asking that you arrive between 8:15 AM and 8:30 AM. If you have an Intermediate or Middle School child, you can drop your child off at those campuses first, then come to the Primary campus to walk in with your Kindergarten student. If you have multiple students at Primary, you may bring both at the 8:15 AM time and walk your Kindergarten child to their classroom. Parents dropping off between 7:00 and 7:30 will need to use the drive on the East side of the building to drop off, and will be unable to walk their child into the classroom. Parents dropping off between 7:30 and 8:30 will be able to walk their child into the classroom and should use the front doors to enter the building. Please let your teacher know, at Meet the Teacher, if you will be walking your child in on the first day.

On Thursday, August 11th, parents will be able to walk their Kindergarten student into the front lobby of the Primary campus. Staff will be on hand to ensure your child gets to the correct class. Please arrive between 8:15 AM and 8:30 AM on the second day as well.

On Friday, August 12th and after, parents are asked to drop their children off in the drive-through lanes on the east side of the building between 7:00 AM and 7:40 AM.

Reminder: <u>Please do not park at the Intermediate campus.</u> Parking is available at Primary or around the drive. Parking map is attached.

First Day of School- 1st & 2nd grade

New to ACA 1st and 2nd grade families will be permitted to walk their children into the classrooms on Wednesday, August 10th. Please park at the Primary campus and walk into the building beginning at 7:30 AM on the first day of school. Please do not park at the Intermediate campus. Parking is available at Primary or around the drive.

On Thursday, August 11th and after, parents are asked to drop their children off in the drive-through lanes on the east side of the building between 7:00 AM and 7:40 AM.

<u>Returning 1st and 2nd grade families</u> are asked to drop their students off on the east side of the Primary building via the drive on August 10th between 7:00 and 7:40 AM.
